#### Pioneer Woman Museum By Nancy Driver

Saturday, September 20, dawned cloudless and cool, a perfect early-fall day, and eleven COJA members were soon headed north on I-35. We took our time, pausing at Love's in Perry for a rest break and conversation, and arrived at our destination, Enrique's Mexican Restaurant at the airport in Ponca City, exactly as they opened. Because of our timely arrival, our group was seated immediately and served promptly. We shared baskets of delicious, warm, homemade tortilla chips (with pockets!) along with guacamole, bean, cheese and salsa dips, while waiting for our individual lunches. Enrique's definitely lived up to their reputation for excellence.



After lunch, we headed for the Pioneer Woman Museum, where we received a short briefing on its history and on the 17 ft. tall statue, "Confident," which stands outside. The statue, depicting a woman in pioneer garb, holding a young boy by the hand and carrying a Bible, was



erected before the museum came into existence, the result of a competition initiated by governor, congressman and oilman E. W. Marland. He invited sculptors to produce models representing the best qualities of pioneer women, and from 12

submissions, "Confident" was chosen. U.S. President Herbert Hoover addressed the crowd from the White House at the statue's dedication ceremony on April 22, 1930, and Will Rogers flew in from California to speak. The crowd of over 40,000 in attendance surpassed the entire population of Ponca City at the time.

Following the introduction, we were free to explore on our own. One area of the museum contained artifacts relating to women from pioneer days to the present, including a cylindrical refrigerator, a typical kitchen and bedroom, and a "permanent wave" machine (scary!). Photographs and short biographies of pioneering women, again up to present day, were in this area as well.

The second room was dedicated to women who overcame boundaries in journalism, from the earliest newspapers to television reporting. Examples of early printing and typesetting methods were on display along with typewriters and examples of reporters' desks. Our host was available to answer questions throughout our visit which added to our enjoyment. We remained for a while speaking with the host. He commented on what a good group we were and that the quality of our questions was excellent. It was a very enjoyable day.
